



WATERSHED PROJECT MANAGER

Our organization:

Trout River Environmental Committee (TREC) is a community based environmental group in the New London Bay – Cavendish area of Prince Edward Island. Our mission is to restore and conserve the natural integrity of our nine watersheds, and to promote good stewardship, so that our watersheds can continue to enhance and support local wildlife, our communities, and the farming, fishing, and tourism industries.

Location: North Granville Community Centre, 575 Taylor Road, North Granville, PEI.

Term: Anticipated start date: July 15th, 2024, for a minimum 6 month term, with possible extension subject to funding

Pay: \$22-25/hr dependant on experience level and funding, 37 hours a week

Education: A degree or diploma in biology, wildlife management, environment, ecology, conservation, or a related field. ***Applicant must be between the ages of 15-30 at the start of the internship***

Responsibilities: Act as Watershed Project Manager, assist in the research and development of projects which focus on:

- Habitat restoration
 - Climate change mitigation
 - Carbon sequestration
 - Working with farmers to reduce environmental impact, improve carbon sequestration and biodiversity
 - Community outreach and education
 - Coastal Restoration

- Work with the Executive Director (ED) in planning, tracking, execution and reporting of environmental projects.
 - Work with the ED to train junior staff on correct techniques in riparian zone management, stream enhancement work, equipment use, data collection etc.
 - Conduct surveys: bat monitoring, water quality monitoring, headwater surveys etc.
 - Maintain social media with regular posts and create environmental educational materials for landowners and community members.
 - Manage water quality data and other data using excel, field notes, photos, GIS and Atlantic DataStream.
 - Use GPS and GIS systems to maintain maps.
 - Maintain public walking trails and community gardens.
 - Communicate and plan with landowners for restoration and monitoring activities, gain permissions to complete work and surveys.
 - Take part in and host environmental educational events and fundraisers.
 - Create management plans for beaver management, invasive species etc.
 - Other duties as required.
